

Charles Garrett Memorial Hunt Planned!

Save the date: April 1-2, 2017

Sign-up starts now!

In honor of our late founder, Garrett is planning a big detecting rally—the Charles Garrett Memorial Hunt, to be held during the weekend of April 1-2, 2017. Those who attend can expect plenty of fun, plenty of prizes to win, and a truly memorable weekend.

The event will be held near the small, historic town of Jefferson, Texas—once a thriving riverport in the 1800s. The Garrett hunt will feature both seeded hunts and native hunting in an area where history dating to the Civil War could potentially be dug.

The Basic Hunt package includes: a free hunt T-shirt (for those who pay



before March 1st); participation in up to four prize hunts; a Saturday lunch; park admission; and tent camping in Diamond Don's RV Park, the site of the Garrett hunt. (RVs are additional cost; check directly with Diamond Don's for rates.)

The two big hunts, a Silver Hunt and a Relic Hunt, each require an additional hunt fee. There are six total hunts, each of which offer contestants the chance to win metal detectors, pinpointers, and Garrett accessories as prizes.

The free Kids' Hunt on Saturday, April 1, is open to children ages 12 and younger, and will be split into two age groups. As with each of the hunts, the field will be seeded with some special tokens that are redeemable for Garrett products.

"The Relic Hunt and the Silver Hunt are expected to be the big draws, but the Free Range hunting within the park could well produce some great finds," says Garrett marketing director Steve Moore. "The RV park sits on historic ground alongside a steamboat terminal and through which Civil War-era railroads ran. The property includes one of the oldest dumps of Jefferson, as well as the remains of a factory that helped supply the Confederates during the Civil War."

Garrett's Code of Detecting Ethics

Charles Garrett always urged his fellow searchers to conduct themselves as responsible treasure hunters and to leave their hunt areas in better condition than they found them. Here are just a few of his keys to good conduct in the field:



- Never trespass or hunt on private property without permission.
- National and state parks/monuments, etc. are absolutely off-limits.
- Always fill in every hole that you dig.
- Do not leave litter or other discarded junk items lying around.
- Always carry out all rubbish and dug targets with you when you leave a search area.
- Use reasonable caution in digging toward any target, particularly in areas where you are uncertain of the ground conditions.
- Keep informed on and obey all local and national legislation relating to the discovery and reporting of found treasures.


The Free Range Hunt will be open to all paid participants of the weekend event. With the exception of areas roped off as seeded hunt fields, the entire RV park can be hunted, including the old dump sites. In addition to whatever old coins and relics may turn up, searchers have the opportunity to dig Garrett tokens that will be sprinkled throughout the property.

"Diggers who take part in the Free Range Hunt will be encouraged to submit their favorite find in several Best Finds categories," Moore continued. "A panel of VIP judges will select their favorite item in each category and award metal detector prizes to the winners."

Hunt packages for the Charles Garrett Memorial Hunt start at \$55, but even non-hunters can enjoy the weekend for a \$5 park entry fee. Kids 12 and under will be admitted free.

"As I began searching the lawn, my AT Pro was picking up signals all over the place. I started only paying

It was great to see her smile."





Secret Society Decoder Pin

Adapted from the popular 1925 comic strip, "Radio Orphan Annie" was first on the air in 1930. Ovaltine was the sponsor of the shows. The programs had encoded messages that could only be deciphered using the Decoder Pins. The "Telematic" Decoder pin was made in 1938. The ROA stands for "Radio Orphan Annie" and the SS stands for "Secret Society." The pressed brass pin measures around 2" in diameter. It has two dials which move freely and show numbers and letters through the holes on the front by which one could obtain the secret messages. This was also seen in the movie *A Christmas Story*.







In addition to more than 60 Wheat pennies, some of the other coins (seen in the picture to the right) include: an 1854 large cent, an 1870 two-cent coin, 1887 and 1907 V-nickels, four Indian Head pennies (1894 to 1906 in date range), plus Barber dimes, Mercury dimes, Buffalo nickels, and even a 1939 World Fair token.

"This is one of my best sites to date," Mike said. "Love my *GTI*; as always, a diehard Garrett guy."




